Approve Contract to Purchase Three (3) Fire Apparatus for Durham County Fire Rescue (DCFR) and Budget Ordinance Amendment No. 18BCC000011 Appropriating Durham County Fire and Rescue Tax District Fund Fund Balance and Appropriating Loan Proceeds to the General Fund to Support the Purchase

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to approve the purchase of two (2) identical Fire Pumpers/Engines and one (1) Fire Tanker for Durham County Fire Rescue (DCFR) totaling \$1,422,703. These vehicles will replace outdated models that are over 25 years old that are currently in use as front line apparatus. The existing DCFR vehicles that these will replace are experiencing an increased out of service rate and are costly to maintain. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA 1901 Annex D) recommends that apparatus be placed out of service if they are more than 25 years old.

The proposed apparatus were designed by a team from DCFR and Durham Fire Department firefighters to ensure appropriate responses in both urban and rural environments. The Board is also requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment No. 18BCC000011 appropriating \$398,873 of Durham County Fire and Rescue Tax District Fund fund balance and appropriating loan proceeds of \$1,023,830 to the General Fund to support the purchase.

The two Engines and Tanker are quoted through the Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC), which is a Government-to-Government procurement service available nationwide. All contracts available to members of HGACBuy have been awarded by virtue of a public competitive procurement process compliant with state statutes. The City of Durham currently purchases their fire apparatus through HGAC. Once an order for new apparatus is submitted, it takes approximately eight months before it is delivered and can be put into service. The proposed contract has been reviewed and approved by the County's Legal Department.

DCFR Service District Fund Balance will be appropriated for the purchase of the Tanker in the amount of \$398,873 and transferred to the County's General Fund. The County will finance the remainder of the purchase of the two engines in the amount of \$1,023,830 with the debt to be paid over a 10-year period. DCFR

Service Tax District funds will be the funding source for the servicing of the debt through annual budgeted transfers of the debt payment amount to the County's Debt Service Fund.

Vision Internet Contract Amendment Requested Will Increase Current Contract from \$39,700 to \$78,730. Phase II of the Project Will Deliver a Fully Hosted Economic Development Themed Website to Durham County

The Board is requested to authorize the County Manager to amend the contract for Vision Internet from 39,700 to 78,730 to deliver a fully hosted Economic Development themed website to Durham County as this will be phase II of the project

This is a request to continue work on the Economic Development website which has been contracted into 2 phases. Phase one is underway with the County Manager approval. Phase 2 is the completion of the project and requires board approval due to the additional amount of funds needed. The end result will be the deployment of a full website for the Economic Development division.

The County had a need for a full website that delivers all relevant economic development facts, guidance for businesses, and demographic information. The County also needed a way to showcase our current businesses, accomplishments, and future plans.

There should be no impact to the proposed action on the current or future year because the funding will come from current operating FY18 funding.

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to approve Capital Project Amendment No. 18CPA000005 appropriating \$403,216 of Collection System Rehabilitation Fund fund balance and appropriate the funds to the Slater Road Pump Station Improvement Capital Project SE053. The Board is also requested to award a construction contract to Carolina Civil Works, Inc. for construction of the Slater Road Pump Station Improvements in the amount of \$366,560 and to authorize the County Manager to execute the contract and to authorize the County Manager to execute any related contract amendments, not to exceed a total project budget of \$403,216.

Slater Road Pump Station Improvement (SE053)

Current Budget: \$0.00

Increase/Decrease: \$403,216.00 Revised Budget: \$403,216.00

The Slater Road Pump Station Improvements include the installation of two new pumps, valves and appurtenances in the existing underground dry-pit station, installation of new level instrumentation, an emergency bypass pump connection, and installation of new electric panels, automatic transfer switch, and conduits. A ten percent contingency is recommended for this project to cover unexpected expenses associated with the underground bypass work.

Durham County issued an Invitation for Bid (IFB 18-002) on August 2, 2017. IFB 18-002 was advertised in local newspapers and on the Durham County website. Additionally, the requirements were emailed to eleven contractors. Three bids were received on August 31, 2017. The bid tabulation is attached.

In review of the MWBE compliance for IFB 18-002 Slater Road Pump Station

Improvements, Carolina Civils Works, Inc. will be utilizing 15.07% MWBE certified Hispanic-American business to be used as subcontracting MWBE participation on this project. The MWBE Compliance Review form is provided as Attachment B.

Alignment With Strategic Plan: This action is in accordance with Durham County Strategic Plan Goal 4: "Environmental Stewardship and Community Prosperity," as this project will ensure adequate sewer pump station capacity to continue to serve the Slater Road Pump Station Sub-basin.

Request for Matching Funds for the NCDOT Apprentice Program Grant

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to approve matching funds in the amount of \$3,740 for Durham County ACCESS to submit a grant proposal for an Apprentice administered by the North Carolina Department of Public Transportation - Public Transportation Division (NCDOT-PTD). Confirmation of the local match is required as a part of the application. Durham County ACCESS will submit the grant application for one Apprentice by November 3, 2017.

Durham County ACCESS is seeking Board approval for the matching funds to engage an Apprentice. NCDOT provides 90% of the cost-- \$37,498 and a 10% local match of \$3,740 is required. This amount is inclusive of salary, benefits and travel allowance. Durham County ACCESS is requesting the County Board approve a budget of \$3,740 for the local share.

If granted, this will be the second Apprentice Durham County has received. The Apprentice Program is a year-long staff position intended to encourage college graduates to serve as an "apprentice" and ultimately pursue a career in public transportation. The Apprentice will fully participate in daily work tasks associated with administrative, financial management, customer service, database and technology tasks, related to running a demand response transportation system. This includes participation in grant preparation and financial management, customer service, marketing and training activities. As part of the Apprenticeship, a special project that will encompass community outreach, marketing and transportation advocacy in the community will be developed and implemented.

A copy of the grant documentation and Apprentice Program are attached for your review.

Alignment With Strategic Plan: This project aligns with Goal 1: Community and Family Prosperity and Enrichment. Durham County is a partner in creating a job and enhancing the economic position of a recent college graduate. Through the hands on work experience, the position allows for an environment to enrich knowledge and provide substantive work experience geared toward launching a stable career in the field of public transportation.

The Board is requested to authorize the County Manager to execute the attached contract with the Greater Durham Chamber of Commerce (Chamber) for services related to industrial recruitment and economic development. The proposed compensation for this contract is in the amount of \$265,000.00. A proposed budget is attached regarding how the Chamber proposes to utilizes these funds in pursuit of the specified tasks and outcomes on behalf of the County. Funds were approved in the FY18 budget for this work and in the required amount.

As discussed with the BOCC during the recent budget process, staff will be working with Chamber staff through Fall 2017 and into Winter/Spring 2018 to develop more robust, outcome-based metrics for these services to better align this dimension of County Economic Development efforts with the recently-adopted DCo Strategic Plan goals and Managing For Results (MFR) processes. Additionally, we will be working towards a goal of a multi-year contract with the Chamber to provide a more streamlined approach towards these new goals. These elements will be further discussed with the BOCC as we move through the FY19 Budget process and deliberations.

The proposed contract with the Chamber supports elements of Goal 1, Goal 4, and Goal 5 by working to increase economic development and thus, community and family prosperity for the community.
