24-0108 Authorize Board Chair to sign Letters of Support for Applications for Environmental Enhancement Grant Funds for County Stormwater Projects

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to authorize the Chair to sign letters of support as part of two applications for grant funding under the North Carolina Attorney General's Office's Environmental Enhancement Grant Program (EEG). The North Carolina Attorney General's Office awards grants annually to projects that will help improve and protect North Carolina's natural resources Since the EEG Program began, the Attorney General has awarded more than \$40 million to nearly 200 projects. These projects have resulted in the closure of 240 abandoned hog waste lagoons and the restoration or permanent conservation of more than 31,000 acres of land, wetland restoration, stormwater remediation, stream stabilization, as well as several environmental education and research initiatives.

Durham County's Stormwater and Erosion Control Division (S&E) has received two (2) of these grants in the past three years, including \$40,000 for a stormwater education program in partnership with North Carolina Central University in 2021 and \$225,000 for the Neal Middle School Bioretention Project in 2022. The S&E Division has identified two (2) new projects for which it is applying for EEG funding and is requesting letters of support from the Board of Commissioners.

First, as part of the Whispering Pines Mobile Home Park Stream Restoration project, the County is planning to incorporate a bioretention area and educational materials to provide water quality benefits and empower residents with knowledge about stormwater management practices, fostering a sense of environmental responsibility and active participation in the community's well-being. This is a piece of the larger overall project which seeks to restore approximately 1,200 linear feet of stream flowing through the park reducing nutrients in the watershed and protecting properties from flooding. A Local Assistance Stormwater Infrastructure Investment grant, received by the County in 2023, is funding the planning and design portion of this project.

Second, the S&E Division is seeking funds to integrate drone technology into our stormwater management and erosion control initiatives to enhance our capabilities and contribute to the overall efficiency and effectiveness of our programs. The proposed project will accomplish this by giving the department the ability to efficiently survey large and previously inaccessible areas, provide real-time data on stormwater infrastructure and erosion control measures, identify potential issues, and facilitate swift response to mitigate stormwater-related problems. The integration of drones in a stormwater program represents the County's commitment to environmental stewardship and innovation by leveraging cutting-edge technology to enhance efficiency, safety, and decision-making in the management of stormwater infrastructure.

to Interlocal Agreement with Central Pines Regional Council for Low to Moderate Income Solarize Program

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to approve the amendment to the Interlocal Agreement with Central Pines Regional Council for the Low to Moderate Income Solarize Program.

The Board of Commissioners approved an interlocal agreement (ILA) with Central Pines Regional Council (CPRC) for \$55,000 on April 10, 2023 to cover the cost of solar installation systems on homes for low-income residents with FY23 funds. This amendment increases the funding by \$150,000 as approved in the FY2024 budget. No new funding is needed. Staff is working with Durham Community Land Trustees, the Durham Housing Authority, and other organizations that provide weatherization and home repair services for low-income households to identify homes for the program, including rental properties designated for permanent low-income housing. The first set of installations is expected to be completed by April 2024.

Installing solar installation systems on low-income housing will reduce monthly utility costs for the residents for the 25 year life-span of the systems. This will free up funds for other necessities like food and medicine. This will also reduce residents' anxiety about using potentially life-saving air conditioning during extreme heat events, thus increasing resident resilience and improving health outcomes.

This interlocal agreement provides for CPRC to administer the funds and provide quality assurance for the installations. The City of Durham has also designated funds for this program and County staff are working with them to coordinate the program throughout Durham.

Approval of a Contract amendment with HDR Engineering Inc of the Carolinas to provide design, bidding, and contract administration for the installation of a whole site generator at the new Northern Convenience Center in the amount of \$30,470 for a not-to-exceed total contract amount of \$660,832.

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to authorize the County Manager to amend the contract with HDR Engineering Inc. of the Carolinas in the amount of \$30,470 to provide design, bidding, and contract administration for the installation of a whole site generator at the

Northern Durham Convenience Center located at 11894 North Roxboro Road. Upon execution of this agreement, the new contract with HDR Engineering Inc. of the Carolinas will be a not-to-exceed amount of \$660,832.00. The contract amendment will use existing project funds available in Capital Improvement Project #4190 DCO79.

HDR Engineering Inc. of the Carolinas was selected to provide design services for this project through RFQ No. 19-007, Architectural Services for Upgrades to Northern Durham County Solid Waste Convenience Sites, advertised on August 11, 2018. HDR assisted the County with the development of the Northern Convenience Center, from master planning and permitting all the way through construction administration. The new convenience center opened in August 2022.

The facility included accommodations for a portable backup generator to provide enough power to maintain operations of key functions of the administrative building, but not to operate the site for waste disposal. A whole site generator would allow the facility to maintain full site operations for citizens during periods of power loss in this area of the County.

Approve Thirumala Restaurant Lease Amendment #4 to Extend Rent Commencement Date to September 1, 2024

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to approve Amendment #4 to the lease between Durham County and Thirumala Hospitality Durham, LLC extending the Rent Commencement to the earlier of 60 days after Tenant's opening for business, or September 1, 2024.

Thirumala Hospitality Durham, LLC entered into a lease agreement for the restaurant suite #140 in the County's Administrative Building II on September 30, 2021. They have diligently pursued the design and bidding of the work required to complete the upfit of the space in accordance with the terms of their lease.

The owners have recently made the difficult decision to terminate the General Contractor that had been performing the upfit of the space. A new General Contractor is now on board and working to get the project back on track.

Schedule delays and difficulties with initial installation of the HVAC and other elements of the upfit have caused the delivery of the restaurant to fall well behind the schedule originally established in the Lease Agreement. This is now the 4th Amendment to the Lease, and we expect the last. The Tenant has worked diligently to successfully solicit bids from qualified contractors, complete the work, and secure the necessary permits. As this is a first-generation use of the space, unexpected issues have arisen that could not have been known by either party in advance.

It is worth reiterating that Tenant's principal is an experienced restaurant operator that has opened a several restaurant concepts throughout the Triangle and elsewhere. The Tenant has expressed their commitment to completing this project and opening this new restaurant in Admin II as soon as they are able.

The tenant is seeking an extension of the Rent Commencement Date to the earlier of 60 days after Tenant's opening for business, or September 1, 2024.

The Board is requested to approve Capital Project Amendment No.24CPA00018 appropriating \$12,421,277 of 2022 General Obligation Bonds (GO Bonds) to two elementary school capital projects: \$8,921,277 to the Glenn Elementary School Capital Project (SH293) and \$3.5M to the Murray-Massenburg Elementary School Capital Project (SH292) to support the design, construction and completion of these projects.

The \$423 million 2022 General Obligation Bond addresses the capital renewal and improvement needs throughout the district and the long-range Capital Improvement Plan.

DPS Administration recommends approval of transfers of 2022 GO Bond funds in the amount of \$12,421,277.00 to be disbursed to support projects in priority order as indicated in the attached Durham County Capital Project Ordinance and authorize staff to submit to the Board of County Commissioners for approval of the transfers.

Projects are supported based on current priority order. Additional funds will be transferred into the 2022 Bond projects to address current phases(design) and scopes of the project(construction), that are delineated in the Durham County Capital Project Ordinance budget adjustment.

Approval of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Nonprofit Grant Program Phase 2 - Small Business Support Grant to Forward Cities, Inc. for \$1.5 million

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to approve an ARPA Nonprofit Grant Phase 2 - Small Business Support Grant to Forward Cities, Inc. for \$1,500,000 in contracted services.

As part of the Board's strategic plan for administering the County's ARPA funding, the Board previously authorized the use of \$1,500,000 for the purposes of providing a grant to an organization to develop and implement a comprehensive ecosystem for entrepreneurial support and to provide targeted supports for small businesses that have been negatively impacted by the pandemic.

As the SBA Navigator program and pilot funding ended in November 2023, the Durham County ARPA Grant Award is an opportunity to leverage the SBA's investment in Durham County and build on E3 Durham's momentum. Forward Cities intends to leverage their E3 Durham experience and this funding opportunity to scale the program by transitioning to a community-informed model that will maintain the navigation function at no-cost to entrepreneurs and add:

- 1. a data-informed and community-designed Ecosystem Strategic Plan;
- 2. a 'learn to earn' program that incentivizes clients to accumulate entrepreneurial education and network connection 'credits' that they can use to procure subsidized professional services from local Business-to-Business (B2B) service providers;
- 3. cohort accelerators that address gaps identified by entrepreneur intake forms, which function as a needs assessment;
- 4. an intentional focus on expanding supports for capital access, certifications and procurement, and;
- 5. a vibrant physical hub of activity based in a culturally rooted downtown coworking community.

Recognizing the tremendous value of the many dedicated area business support organizations and service providers who work tirelessly to equip Durham County business owners, this program earmarks nearly 50% programmatic funding pass-through. Funds will pass through to 1) enrolled entrepreneurs to reduce the cost of doing business and 2) service providers to engage their expertise and increase their ability to effectively and sustainably serve the community.

The E3 Durham Venture Studio (final name TBD) will operate over an initial 24-month period with integrated sustainability and capacity building efforts at the ecosystem and entrepreneur levels - to ensure impact for years to come. A detailed scope of work and contract are listed in the attachments.

24-0171 Approval to Advertise 2023 Tax Liens on Real Property

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to authorize the Tax Administrator to provide public notice and advertise the 2023 delinquent real property tax liens. North Carolina General Statute 105-369 requires the Tax Collector to report to the governing board the total

amount of unpaid taxes for the current year that are liens on real property. Tax liens may be advertised any time between March 1 and June 30.

A notice alerting property owners of the pending advertisement must be mailed at least 30 days in advance of the date of advertisement. This mailed notice stated the last day to pay 2023 taxes to avoid being advertised is March 6, 2024. Between the mailed notice and the advertisement, property owners are advised that collection efforts may be underway. North Carolina General Statute 105-369 mandates the notice to the property owner and the advertisement. The Tax Collector is required to determine the cost of the advertisement and to set a fee to cover the actual costs (§105-369.(d)). The cost for advertising will be \$7.50 per parcel to cover the costs of advertising all tax liens in the Herald Sun.
