Approval of Interlocal Agreement with the City of Durham to Use American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds to Support Efforts to Improve Digital Equity totaling \$750,000.

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to approve the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with the City of Durham to use American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to support the City's digital equity program. Under ARPA program requirements, Durham County is permitted to utilize ARPA funding to support programs that are aimed at responding to and mitigating the negative economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, including programs to provide internet access to qualifying households and individuals, and to promote digital literacy more broadly as part of a community's response to the economic impacts of the pandemic. Substantial evidence has shown that barriers to accessing and skillfully utilizing digital resources exacerbate economic challenges for affected individuals and households, creating obstacles for these groups to access employment opportunities, educational services, income supports, and health services that are available in their communities. Both the City and County have identified closing this digital divide within the County as a priority strategy to promote economic opportunities for historically underserved and vulnerable communities, particularly in light of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The proposed Interlocal Agreement would subgrant \$750,000 of the County's total ARPA allocation to the City to support the City's Digital Inclusion Program. Funding will be utilized by the City to support the development and expansion of the City's Digital Inclusion team, provide outdoor high-speed internet access at Durham Parks and Recreation sites, develop a distribution program to connect eligible households to internet-enabled devices, improve digital literacy and resilience of seniors in communal living facilities, and to provide workforce exposure and training opportunities for youth in Durham County.

Alignment with Strategic Plan: This item aligns with Goal 1, Regional Leadership - Objective 1 (Connect Durham residents to good jobs and economic opportunities); Goal 3, Empowered Community (Offer and encourage access to tools, services, support groups, and educational opportunities for diverse communities).

<u>County Manager's Recommendation</u>: The County Manager recommends that the Board approve the Interlocal Agreement with the City of Durham, and to authorize the County Manager to develop and execute all documents required to

24-0605 Approval of Annual Settlement of 2023 Property Taxes and Charge of 2024 Property Taxes to the Tax Collector

Agenda Text: The Board is requested to approve the 2023 Tax Settlement and Charge the Tax Collector with the 2024 taxes.

As required by G.S. 105-373, the Tax Administrator is herewith submitting the settlement report of 2023 property taxes. The annual settlement provides in detail the collection for the County, all fire and special districts and the City of Durham, BID, City of Raleigh, Towns of Chapel Hill, Morrisville and Cary during Fiscal Year 2023-2024.

G.S. 105-373 (h) further authorizes the Board of County Commissioners to relieve the Tax Collector of the charges of taxes on classified motor vehicles that are one year or more past due.

Additionally, the General Statutes bar use of any remedies for collection enforcement that is not instituted within 10 years of said taxes becoming due.

Furthermore, pursuant to G.S. 105-321 (b), the Board of County Commissioners charges the Tax Collector with the 2024 Property Tax Receipts.

The Tax Administrator requests authorization to relieve charges of taxes that are beyond the statute of limitations of 10 years and those vehicles that are more than two (2) years past due.

County Manager's Recommendation: The County Manager recommends that the Board receive and approve the 2023 Property Tax Settlement Report and authorize the Chair to sign the resolution accepting it as reported for entry into the minutes and to authorize the release of taxes that are more than 10 years past due and motor vehicles taxes that are more than 2 years past due. The County Manager further recommends the Board to issue the Order to Collect to the Tax Collector for Fiscal Year 2024 - 2025.

24-0609 Discussion and Approval of 2025 Federal Legislative Goals for NCACC (10min)

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to discuss and vote on any proposed Federal Legislative Goals and forward them to the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners for inclusion in its legislative process.

Every biennium, the NCACC solicits input and proposals from our counties concerning federal issues that impact North Carolina counties. To help ensure deliberation on federal goals, the process is designed to provide opportunities for input and discussion from counties on proposed federal goals.

Goal proposals should include contact information, goal language and background. Background information should address the need for the proposal and provide historical context if available or any other relevant information.

The NCACC Board of Directors will meet in October to review and approve a package of federal goals. The package of federal goals approved by the Board of Directors will go before the voting body at the Legislative Goals Conference in Raleigh to be held Nov. 14-15.

Typically, discussion items are presented at the Board's work session, but the deadline to submit goals is Oct 4 which falls before the next work session. Staff will receive from the Board any potential federal items that members want to submit and will forward approved items and any background information to NCACC by the deadline.

The Equalization and Review Board shall be exempt from these term limits.
