





Four-part Performance Cycle

- Plan
- Budget
- Manage
- Evaluate and Learn

What gets Measured gets Done.





All programming funded by the County will be monitored using performance measures.





Management of MFR

- The Managing for Results
 Model requires managers to
 be accountable for program
 performance objectives
- Employees have a line of sight to know how his/her performance contributes to organizational performance

Learning Labs and Workshops


Board supports proposal made by employees with tweak to customer service area



Managing for Results Model: Main Components






Managing for Results Model: Main Components
