

- Google Cloud Hub, which will eventually bring 1,000 jobs to the area.

Primary ways counties may invest ARPA Funds:

Support public health response: COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral health care and certain county public health, public safety, human services and

other related staff

Address negative economic impacts: Respond to economic harms to workers, families, small businesses,

impacted industries and rehiring of public sector workers (including

county staff)

Use funds to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue Replace public sector revenue loss:

experienced during the pandemic – this provision allows a much broader use of funds

Offer additional compensation, up to \$13 per hour in additional wages, to those – both county employees and other workers in the community – who have faced and continue to Premium pay for essential workers:

face the greatest health risks due to their service.

Water and sewer infrastructure: Make necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water, invest in wastewater

and stormwater infrastructure

Broadband infrastructure: Provide investments to provide unserved or underserved locations with new or expanded

broadband access

Funds must be *incurred* and obligated

DECEMBER 31, 2026:

Funds must be *expended* to cover obligations and all work must be completed

 Created to protect LGBTQIA+ residents from discriminatory practicies.




ARPA Allocations to Date

Total Earmarked to Date: \$5.1 million

- Janitorial contracts for COVID-19 County building cleaning standards: \$1.2 million*
- Increased security services due to COVID-19: \$530,000*
- COVID Screening in high traffic areas to include HHS, Courthouse and Libraries: \$515,000*
- Support for ongoing non-congregate housing needs: \$936,000*
- Indirect revenue loss / increased expenses for Durham Convention Center: \$408,000
- Court Facility fees revenue loss from COVID-19: \$260,000
- Vaccine Equity Community Health Workers: \$650,000
- School Health Nurses partial offset: \$550,000
- Minority Business Community Infrastructure Support: \$50,000




