- WHEREAS, African Americans have been leaders in securing their right to vote and participate equally as full society members through the abolitionist, emancipation, and civil rights movements. They have also been instrumental in the industrial labor movement and many other national and international movements; and
- **WHEREAS,** despite the undeniable impact African Americans have made in history, significant work remains to ensure full equality and access for Black people everywhere; and
- **WHEREAS,** African Americans of every age, gender, and culture has a story to tell and gifts to share with the world; and
- WHEREAS, additional attention is given to African Americans during Black History Month, it is important to understand every month that countless African Americans have been undervalued and inadequately recognized for their contributions to our community, our nation, and our world; and
- **WHEREAS,** African Americans and their allies will continue to work to ensure they are never silenced, and their stories of achievement can be told; and
- **WHEREAS**, every person is called to be advocates and allies for African Americans.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Nida Allam, Chair and on behalf of the Durham Board of County Commissioners, do hereby proclaim February 2025 as
