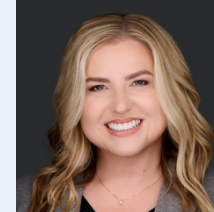

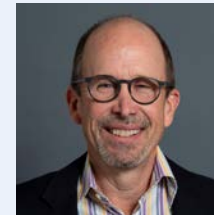
**Desiree Thomas, MBA, MSN, R, NEA-BC, FACHE**

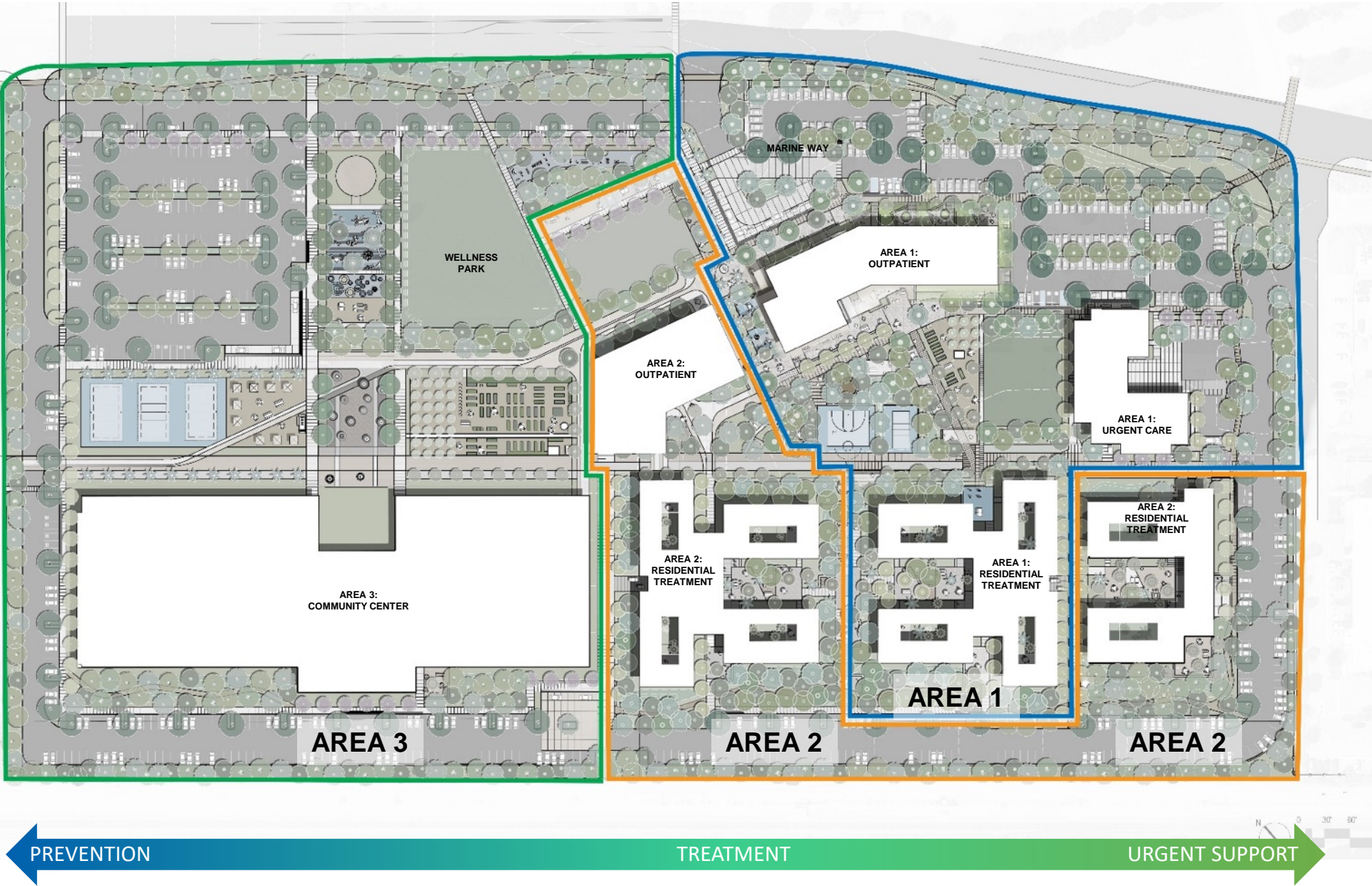

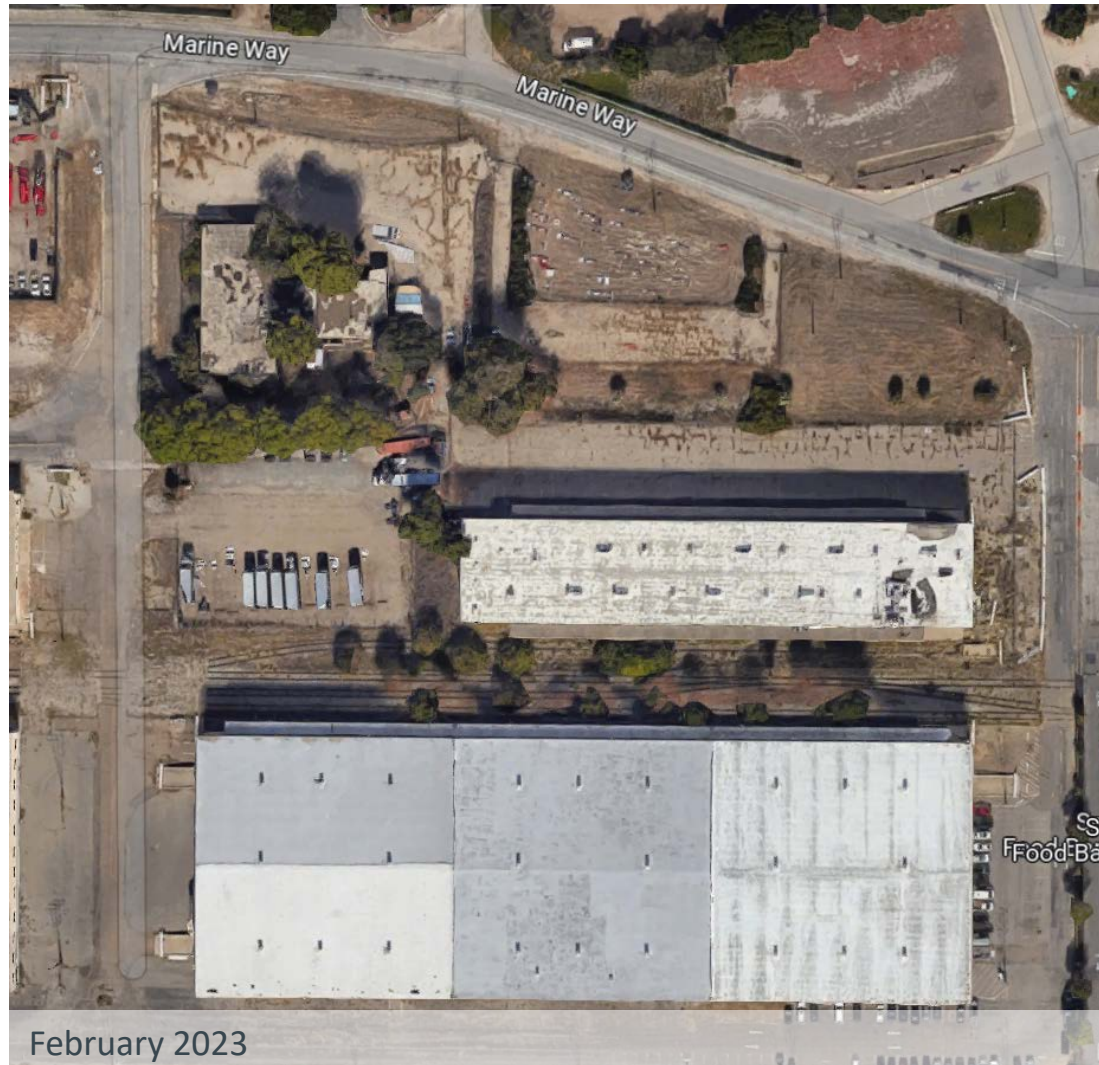

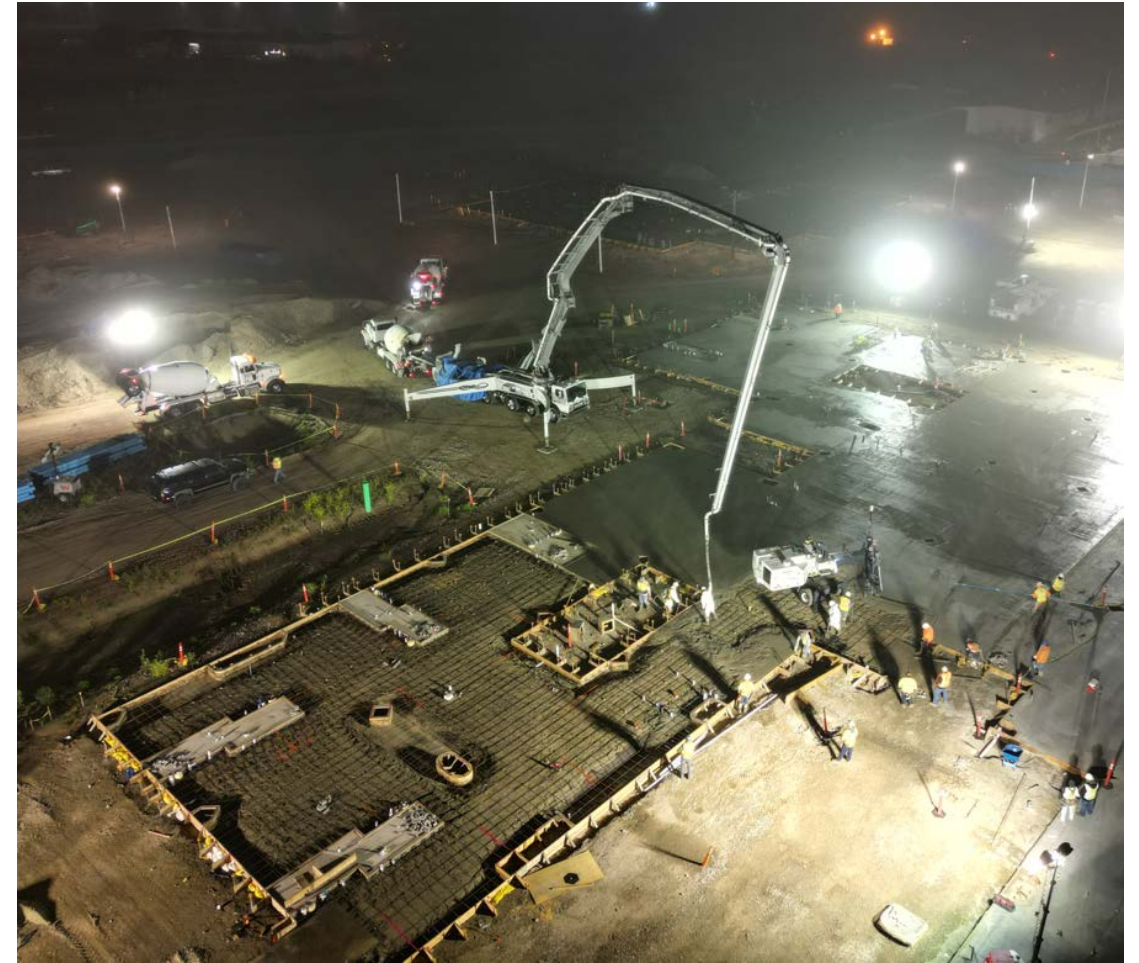
