## **Current Activities –**

- Provide consultation and discussion regarding data collection and evaluation of the peers-in-ER pilot
- Share information and coordinate with Duke Medicine healthcare providers and researchers regarding Duke E.H.R. data
- Increase understanding of existing data resources that monitor substance use crisis in Durham (or resources that may be used to monitor it.)
  - Durham county (EMS, various Duke projects)
  - o State resources (NC DHHS IVP)
  - o Research and evaluation projects already underway
- Learn about local initiatives that are likely to have an impact on Durham
  - O How Duke Medicine is addressing opioid crisis
  - MAT in Durham County detention facility (jail)
- Establish community of data providers/analysts
  - o These relationships set a foundation for future collaboration and data-sharing

## Measures -

- . Generally we aspire to use measures that already exist
  - Outcomes: MAT-prescribing, overdose, opioid-prescribing
  - Demographics/social determinants: gender, age, , race/ethnicity, insurance, geographic location, etc.

- Continue current activities
- Duke E.H.R. data: Create a data "wish list" for Duke E.H.R. data, and negotiate a feasible plan for regular sharing of aggregate data (e.g., ER overdoses, opioid prescribing, MAT prescribing)
- Increase coordination with other Durham Joins groups (or join forces?)
