June 19 – July 27, 2017: Monday - Thursday (8am- 4pm)

- Install 6 stormwater Best Management Practices (BMPs) at schools and in the community: 1 structural stormwater conveyance, 1 rain garden, 1 grass swale, 1 riparian buffer, and 2 critical area plantings;
- Provide BMP maintenance at schools and in the community;
- Plant and maintain vegetable gardens throughout the community, donating any harvested produce to local charities;
- Participate in a hands-on rain water harvesting training and Rain Garden Design & Installation training(s), and;
- Tour nurseries and farms to learn more about careers in agriculture and the green industry.

2017 BETC Summer Green Team Outcomes

- Grant funding leveraged by Soil & Water: \$48,121
- Combined total 3,000+ hours of green infrastructure training
- > 6 new stormwater BMPs installed, 9 maintained:
 - 4,500 sf of sod installed
 - 299 plants installed
 - 45 trees planted in a 3,000 sf riparian buffer
 - 1,294 sf of rain gardens weeded & mulched
- > 6 vegetable gardens maintained:
 - 129 vegetable plants installed
 - 890 sf of vegetable gardens weeded & mulched
- 6 new Certified Residential Rain Garden Professionals (BETC teachers)
