Tax Payment Help Program for 2024 Property Taxes

The following Options are available to assist citizens in Durham County with payment of property taxes. This program does not include Registered Motor Vehicle taxes. The following programs are intended to ensure your taxes are fully paid prior to becoming delinquent.

<u>**Pre-Payment Tax Help**</u> is a voluntary program in which a citizen is provided an estimate of a tax bill and allowed to pay prior to the creation of the 2024 tax bill. The citizen may choose when and how much they wish to pay before the delinquent date. Citizens must provide the account number and parcel number for the property to which payments are to be applied. <u>To be eligible to participate, previous years' taxes must be paid in full</u>.

<u>Post-Billing Payment Tax Help</u> is a plan provided to assist with payments after the 2024 tax bills have been issued. The tax office will work with the citizens to establish scheduled payments to ensure that the bill is paid in full before the delinquent date (after January 6th). To be eligible to participate, previous years' taxes must be paid in full.
