# ABOUT KIDS VOTING DURHAM

Kids Voting Durham is non-partisan program of the Durham County Cooperative Extension that helps youth under 18 believe in and understand the power they have as engaged citizens and informed voters. Through a combination of hands-on learning opportunities, youth voice activities, family engagement, & and an authentic voting experience Kids Voting builds the knowledge, skills, and sense of agency youth need to take full part in our community's civic life and our country's democratic practices now and as adults.









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# WHY SHOULD KIDS VOTE?







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Youth who are exposed to voting in elections in elementary school are 40% more likely to vote as adults. Youth reach adulthood confident in their civic & voting skills.

INCREASED ADULT VOTER TURNOUT

Youth act as civic instigators; KVUSA research has shown 3-6% increase in adult voting in KV communities.

STRONGER YOUTH COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Youth gain knowledge, skills, and motivation to be more active civic participants in their communities NOW as well as in future

EQUITABLE CIVIC OPPORTUNITIES

KVD expands youth who have access to civic engagement experiences & helps to close identified civic opportunity gaps for youth.

HEALTHIER COMMUNITIES

Research shows that a community's economic and physical health are often directly correlated with its civic health.



- Durham families who are expecting-5 years old can receive clothing, diapers & accessories <u>once every 2 months</u>, <u>by</u> <u>APPOINTMENT ONLY</u>.
- Durham Families who are 6 months pregnant –5yrs can receive children's clothes, diapers & accessories
- Expecting families starting at 4months can receive Maternity clothes & breastfeeding supplies.
- ALL items are based on availability.
- Children are not required to come to appointments. If children are present, they need to be in the appropriate car seat and buckled up.






