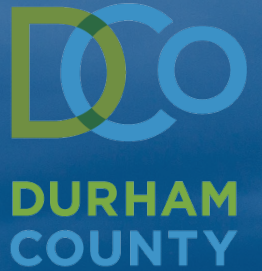

DCoDPH Key Divisions, Programs & Initiatives

The ***Health Education and Community Transformation Division*** addresses health by influencing the decisions and actions that individuals, groups, and communities make to promote health and prevent injury, disease, and disability.

Staff members provide in-person and virtual education, screenings, and evidence-based programs to individuals, neighborhoods, faith-based organizations, and workplaces.

The ***Nutrition Division*** provides population-based and individual clinical services so Durham County residents can learn and practice behaviors that prevent disease and promote optimal health.

Clinical services, Durham's Innovative Nutrition Education (DINE) Program, Chronic Care Initiative (formerly Durham Diabetes Coalition), and The Formerly Incarcerated Transition (FIT) Program are ***programs operating within our Nutrition Division***




DCoDPH Opportunities for Engagement

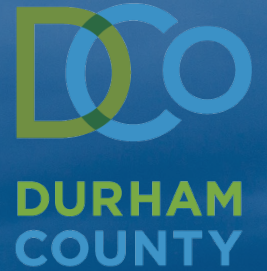

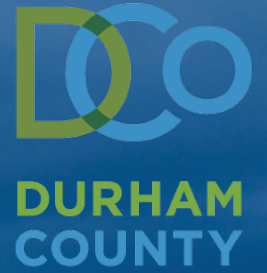
