Agenda Adjustments

Chairman Reckhow made the following adjustments:

- Removal of Consent Agenda Item No. 1, <u>Award of Contracts for Fleet Maintenance and Repair Services (RFP# 05-001R)</u>, to come back before the Board at a later date; and
- Additions—Reappointment to the Downtown Durham Inc. Board of Directors and Appointment to the Cultural Plan Steering Committee.

Chairman Reckhow pointed out that the following agenda items had been revised: Resolution Regarding Increasing the State Cigarette Tax to Support County Medicaid Relief and Consent Agenda Item No. m, Community Health Trust Fund Policy.

Chairman Reckhow announced Durham County's receipt of a National Association of Counties (NACo) National Achievement Award for Neighborhood College, which is a joint effort with the City of Durham. She thanked Deborah Craig-Ray, Assistant County Manager, and Public Information staff for doing a great job. Chairman Reckhow invited interested persons to register in August for the September session of Neighborhood College.

Recognition of City of Medicine High School Awards

Chairman Reckhow stated that the City of Medicine High School Awards is a program of the Greater Durham Chamber of Commerce and is sponsored by The Merck Foundation and Duke University Health System (DUHS). This is the 10th year of awarding the program, which is designed to reward Durham students seeking to achieve a career in the healthcare industry. The scholarships are awarded to seniors who have demonstrated high academic performance, participated in community service activities, and chosen to pursue a career in the field of medicine. Chairman Reckhow thanked the Chamber of Commerce for coordinating the awards program.

Chairman Reckhow recognized representatives from The Merck Foundation and Duke University Health System for comments: Pamela Sutton-Wallace, Chief of Staff for Duke Chancellor for Health Affairs; MaryAnn Black, Director of Community Affairs, DUHS; and Agnes Speight, Public Affairs Coordinator, The Merck Foundation.

Chairman Reckhow recognized the following students for remarks:

Atir Carter of Hillside High School, Honorable Mention winner for a \$500 Scholarship, was not present for remarks.

Chairman Reckhow congratulated the 2005 City of Medicine Award Winners and wished them luck in their future endeavors.

May Anchor Award Winner—Benjamin Massey

Deputy Benjamin Massey, Durham County Sheriff's Office, was selected to receive the May Anchor Award. Deputy Massey was recognized for this honor because of superior work, particularly for his performance during a house call to Inverness Drive in December 2004.

Chief Deputy Wes Crabtree elaborated that Deputy Massey went beyond the call of duty to check on the welfare of a citizen after receiving a telephone call from a distant relative. Deputy Massey not only rescued the fallen victim, but also potentially saved her life.

Deputy Massey briefly thanked the Board for the recognition. He received a standing ovation.

Chairman Ellen Reckhow presented the Anchor Award to Deputy Benjamin Massey.

Resolution Condemning Cross Burnings on May 25, 2005

Chairman Reckhow stated that Durham County Government strongly condemns the cowardly acts of cross burnings that occurred in Durham on Wednesday, May 25, 2005. A resolution was prepared which calls upon the citizens of Durham to work towards peace and reconciliation among all races and further supports efforts to find the perpetrators and bring them to justice. Chairman Reckhow thanked Commissioner Cheek for offering a reward as an effort to seek additional information on the act.

Commissioner Page read the following resolution:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on May 25, 2005 three burning crosses were discovered at three locations in the Durham community; and

WHEREAS, from St. Luke's Episcopal Church on Hillandale Road, to South Roxboro Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway and Dillard and Holloway Streets, the crosses burned their way into the landscape of this community; and

WHEREAS, this cowardly and dastardly act of domestic terrorism continues to be viewed as the ultimate symbol of racial hate and intimidation in this country; and

WHEREAS, Durham County Government strongly supports the ongoing efforts by local, state and federal law enforcement agencies to vigorously pursue those responsible for this ultimate hate crime and to prosecute to the fullest extent of the law; and

WHEREAS, while this horrific act is despicable, it has served to bring our diverse community together to demonstrate community solidarity in its wake; and

WHEREAS, the outpouring of unity at several community gatherings and particularly at the large community unity rally held on Sunday June 5, has been a powerful message to the perpetrators that Durham, even with its differences, can gather under one tent in the face of adversity:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, the members of the Durham County Board of Commissioners, do hereby denounce the recent cross burnings in Durham; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we ask all Durham residents to recommit themselves to promoting racial harmony, and work in positive ways to build bridges of help and hope by engaging in efforts to seek resolution to issues facing this community.

Each Commissioner made comments supporting the resolution.

Chairman Reckhow recognized signed speaker <u>Dr. E. Lavonia Allison</u>, Chair of the Durham Committee on the Affairs of Black People, P.O. Box 428, Durham, NC 27702, to make comments.

Chairman Reckhow addressed Dr. Allison's comments, stating that City-County programs (i.e. Affordable Housing, DPS Closing the Achievement Gap, etc.) are underway to improve the lives of Durham citizens. She recommended that concerned citizens contact the County Manager's office if they wish to become involved with the programs.

Resolution Regarding Increasing the State Cigarette Tax to Support County Medicaid Relief

Chairman Reckhow reported that Medicaid relief is one of the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners' priority legislative issues. North Carolina is one of two states that requires county governments to participate in all costs of Medicaid. Recently, New York took action to lower the costs of Medicaid to its counties.

Chairman Reckhow read the following resolution into the record:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, only New York and North Carolina require county governments to participate in all the costs of Medicaid; and

WHEREAS, recently, New York took action to lower the costs of Medicaid to its counties; and

WHEREAS, Medicaid costs for counties continue to outstrip county governments' ability to provide those increases through the traditional source of flexible revenue—i.e. the property tax; and

WHEREAS, Durham County Government is projected to spend \$10.8 million in 2004-05 for Medicaid which equates to 5 cents on the property tax rate; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina counties have no opportunity under federal and state law to control Medicaid expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly's Blue Ribbon Commission on Medicaid Reform recognized and endorsed the need for county Medicaid relief; and


WHEREAS, a plan to completely phase out required county Medicaid expenditures is desirable; and

WHEREAS, cigarette smoking contributes to health problems that increase Medicaid costs; and

WHEREAS, increasing the state's cigarette tax could yield significant funds to reduce the county share of Medicaid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, the members of the Durham County Board of Commissioners, do hereby urge the General Assembly of North Carolina to enact a significant cigarette tax increase with a substantial portion of the tax to be used to begin a phase-out of required county contributions to fund Medicaid costs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the leaders of the House and Senate and members of the Durham delegation.



Chairman Reckhow stated that copies of the resolution would be forwarded to General Assembly House Speaker James Black, Senate Pro Tempore Marc Basnight, and members of the Durham Delegation.

Vice-Chairman Heron relayed information from the National Association of Counties' attorney that a 55-cent tax on cigarettes would relieve all counties in North Carolina of their Medicaid costs (\$11 million for Durham County).

Chairman Reckhow called signed speaker <u>Dr. E. Lavonia Allison</u>, P.O. Box 428, Durham, NC 27702, forward for comments.

Chairman Reckhow informed Dr. Allison that Representative Verla Insko, Orange County, has submitted a bill to raise the cigarette tax to 75 cents to relieve counties of their Medicaid costs. She encouraged citizens in favor of the tax to urge the state representatives to support Representative Insko's bill.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
FOR THE COUNTY OF DURHAM, NORTH
CAROLINA, DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO
REIMBURSE SAID COUNTY FROM THE PROCEEDS
OF ONE OR MORE TAX-EXEMPT FINANCINGS FOR
CERTAIN EXPENDITURES IN CONNECTION WITH
THE ACQUISITION OF LAND TO PROVIDE OPEN
SPACES.

WHEREAS, the County of Durham, North Carolina (the "County"), is a political subdivision organized and existing under the laws of the State of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the County has paid, beginning no earlier than April 14, 2005, and will pay, on and after the date hereof, certain expenditures in connection with the acquisition of approximately 42.8 acres of land from Duke University to provide trails, greenways and other open spaces for the County (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners for the County (the "Board") has determined that certain moneys of the County previously advanced no earlier than April 14, 2005 and to be advanced on and after the date hereof by the County to pay such expenditures (the "Expenditures") are available only for a temporary period and it is and will be necessary to reimburse the County for the Expenditures from the proceeds of one or more tax-exempt financings in the form of one or more issues of general obligation

bonds of the County that are expected to be authorized in the amount of \$12,230,000 pursuant to a bond order to be adopted by the Board in 2006 (collectively the "Tax-exempt Financings");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board as follows:

Section 1. The Board hereby declares the County's intent to reimburse the County with the proceeds of the Tax-exempt Financings for the Expenditures made on and after April 14, 2005, which date is no more than 60 days prior to the date hereof. The County reasonably expects on the date hereof that it will reimburse the Expenditures with the proceeds of the Tax-exempt Financings.

Section 2. Each Expenditure was or will be (a) of a type properly chargeable to a capital account under general federal income tax principles (determined in each case as of the date of the Expenditure), (b) a cost of issuance with respect to the Tax-exempt Financings, (c) a nonrecurring item that is not customarily payable from current revenues or (d) a grant to a party that is not related to or an agent of the County so long as such grant does not impose any obligation or condition (directly or indirectly) to repay any amount to or for the benefit of the County.

Section 3. The maximum principal amount of the Tax-exempt Financings expected to be entered into with respect to the Project is \$900,000.

Section 4. The County will make a reimbursement allocation, which is a written allocation by the County that evidences the County's use of proceeds of the Taxexempt Financings to reimburse an Expenditure, no later than 18 months after the later of the date on which the Expenditure is paid or the Project is placed in service or

abandoned, but in no event more than three years after the date on which the Expenditure is paid. The County recognizes that exceptions are available for certain preliminary expenditures, costs of issuance, certain de minimis amounts, expenditures by small issuers (based on the year of issuance and not the year of expenditure) and expenditures for construction projects of at least five years.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

Public Hearing on the 2005-06 Recommended Budget

The Board of County Commissioners conducted a public hearing to receive citizen input on the FY 2005-2006 recommended budget. To be able to hear from all interested citizens, Chairman Reckhow set a time limit of two minutes for each speaker.

County Manager Mike Ruffin made comments about Durham Public Schools' (DPS) budget. He clarified the misconception that DPS would not receive funding to assist with classified salary inequities or teacher supplements. County Manager Ruffin explained that the Board of County Commissioners grants DPS a lump sum appropriation; the final decision regarding funding expenditure lies with the Board of Education.

Chairman Reckhow added that the County Manager's recommended budget for DPS includes \$82,307,000 for current expense, \$1,500,000 for capital, and over \$17 million for debt service. The total recommended budget would consume over two-thirds of property tax revenue for next year.

Chairman Reckhow thanked the speakers for voicing their opinions and concerns, which will be considered when finalizing the budget.

In response to citizen comments pertaining to crime-fighting initiatives, Chairman Reckhow corrected the fallacy that the County would be incorporating initiatives without a budget increase. \$500,000 for new safety initiatives has been included in the budget.

Chairman Reckhow referenced the legislative report submitted by the County lobbyist. The report revealed that the State-House budget includes monies to restore funding for drug and family courts in Durham and to fund two district court judges, three assistant district attorneys, and five deputy clerks of court. Chairman Reckhow encouraged citizens who support these increases in court personnel to urge Senators Jeanne H. Lucas

and Bob Atwater to advocate for the increases. She relayed for the County Attorney that the County could not legally fund judges.

Chairman Reckhow responded to Mr. Mullinax's concern for Animal Control officers, stating that a salary study for all employees is being conducted. She also communicated to Dr. Allison that her questions would be addressed at a later date.

Commissioner Cheek advocated teacher supplements and funding for Tiers 1, 2, and 3 in the court system. He stated his support for the 3-cent tax increase.

Commissioner Cousin echoed Commissioner Cheek's support for teacher supplements. He also supported classified personnel increases in DPS' budget and increasing Operation Breakthrough's funding.

Chairman Reckhow stated her support for teacher salary supplement increases and classified salary increases.

Vice-Chairman Heron favored reviewing the DPS budget to ensure that the teachers receive salary and supplement increases. She stressed that the State has the responsibility to fund additional judicial personnel; therefore, she would not support the Manager's budget to fund Tiers 1, 2, and 3.

Chairman Reckhow informed the Board of a spreadsheet provided by Kay James, Durham Public Education Network. It ranks Durham as second highest in the state for teacher salary supplements, which is extremely competitive with surrounding and major districts in North Carolina.
